CHANGING LIVES

As the SA Foundation provides housing, recovery programs, job training and childcare and as we pray for the survivors that come through our front doors, we have found over the past 25 years that one common denominator always seems to prevail in all their stories: childhood sexual abuse. In most cases they were told it didn't happen, or they never told anyone at all.

Self-loathing, shame and guilt crept into their lives and heart, which started them to think differently about themselves. Lies of abusers kept them thinking destructive thoughts that made them even more vulnerable to pimps and traffickers. As we work with young girls, we have seen that many times they believed it was their fault they were abused, or they felt like they deserved it.

Getting to the root of these issues is the focus and purpose of the SA Foundation's recovery program and all our resources are committed to the full recovery of these women and in breaking the cycle of abuse in the lives of their children.

A Poem from an SA Program Participant:

I understand I must love myself, before I can love others. I understand I must be open, so I can open others unto themselves. I understand I must be honest, if I expect that of a friend. I understand I must speak the truth, if I am to hear the truth spoken. I understand I must reach out to people, if I am to be touched. I understand my knowledge must be used, if I am to grow. I understand I must share, if I am to be given to. I understand J must share, if I am to be given to. I understand J must have freedom, if I am to be free.

Our young participant touched a core issue in the last sentence of her poem. This is why the SA Foundation offers intensive training and mentoring to its leadership as they seek to implement the program model in their city

PROGRAM CONSULTATIONS

One of the ways that the SA Foundation helps young women to escape sexual exploitation and trafficking is to equip leaders in existing non-profit organizations to deliver the SA program model.

Using its Vancouver location as the Internship Centre, leaders are provided with a 2-week intensive training in the residential and day programs. Currently, the Foundation is working with groups in:

TRAINING TRIP TO NEPAL

In April 2013 our Director of Training & Program Development travelled to Nepal to provide advanced training on delivering the SA Foundation's recovery programming.

It has been four years since this director has been to Nepal to give such training and she was amazed at the quality of programming that has been given during this time. Despite having limited understanding of recovery and the healing process, Nepali staff have been able to implement almost the entire program curriculum and stated that they have been learning and growing alongside the women that they serve. They have covered such topics as: Boundaries, Communication, Self-Esteem, Relationships, Co-Dependency, and Healing from Trauma and have implemented an effective informal counseling program to help survivors of sexual exploitation and trafficking in their country.

While there, our director was so priviledged to be a part of the baptism of 2 program participants! While it is not mandatory that program participants participate in daily bible readings and Christian activities, many of the women choose to participate and find great hope and healing through Christ.

We would like to thank Steven N. who generously provided the airfare for the trip.

We are very proud of the program in Nepal and in the next few years we are aiming to start a second house for mothers as support is raised.

The team launched their day program on the same day and promptly began giving classes.

Many contacts have been made by the team for program referrals, including the support of a local police chief and his team, several international organizations and a local shelter whose leader, when they found out about the SA program in Budapest, wept for joy as they would now have a placement for the trafficking victims who come regularly through their doors.
